**Robert J. Kinsey Award**

The first annual Robert J. Kinsey Award was presented at the 1984 Juvenile Judges Symposium. Judge Kinsey received the award in recognition of his years of service and dedication to improving the well being of Indiana's children. He gained statewide recognition for his creative and innovative approaches to the problems facing children and youth.

Judge Kinsey lived with integrity and dedication to the children of Howard County and the State of Indiana. He died April 9, 1985. Each year, an award is presented in his name to a judge with juvenile jurisdiction who best exemplifies the characteristics that set Judge Kinsey apart from others in his support and service to children.

Nomination is open to any Indiana judge with juvenile jurisdiction, and may be submitted by individuals as well as agencies. A selection committee, comprised of statewide human service professionals, chooses the recipient and presents the award each year at the Juvenile Judges Symposium.
